
## Home Counties hawking Club September Newsletter written by Jem

# A controversial subject! How does one measure success in falconry?

Falconry is the hunting of quarry with birds of prey, so how does one measure success? Is it the head count obtained with a bird during the season? Or is it the out standing hunts with a bird which may or may not result in a kill? Or possibly the taking of a particular species with a bird e.g. Goshawk taking a Hare, or a Harris hawk taking a Goose.

For me head count is a reflection of the time put in and the success of the bird, although high counts can be attained by taking young inexperienced quarry early in the season.
